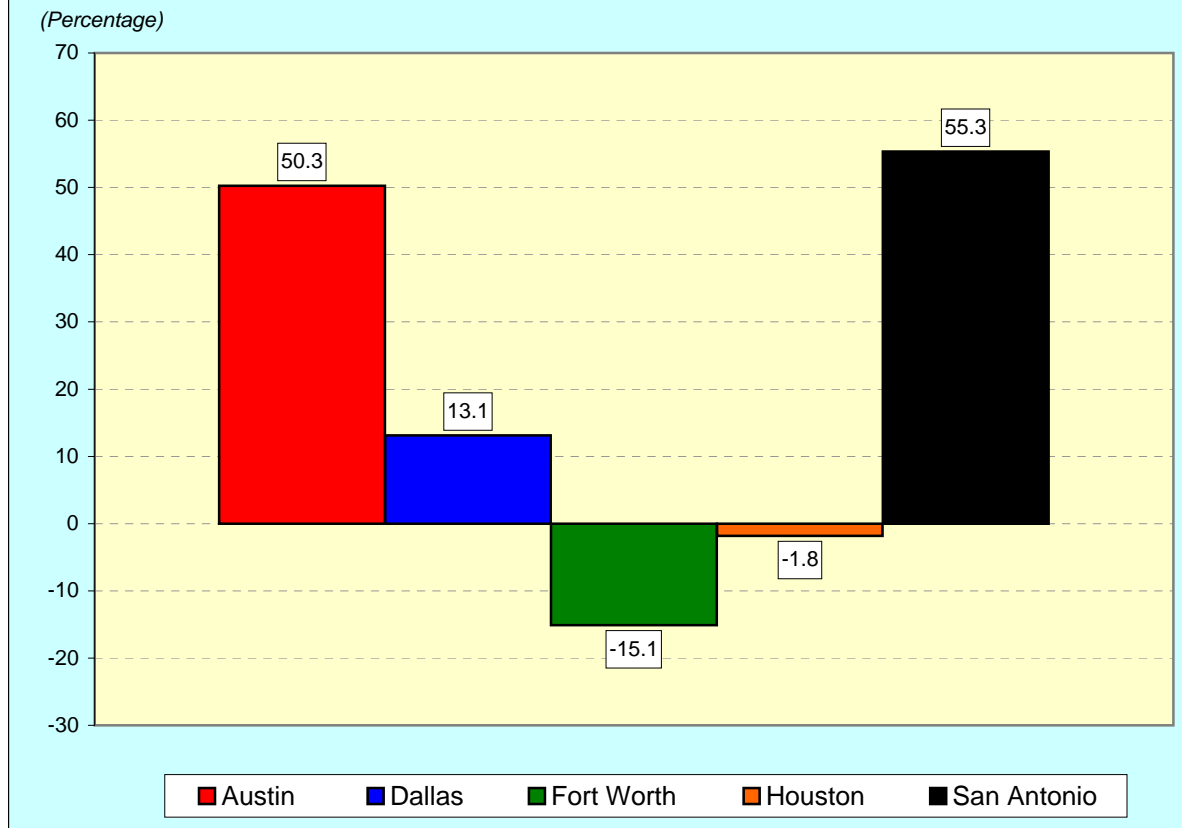


Total Percentage Change in High-Tech Employment in Selected Texas Cybercities from 1990 to 2005
